Caring for your child

Making sure your child is happy and settled at St Peter's is a high priority for us and we do everything we can to ensure your child is well looked after while they are in our care.

We know your child is a long way from friends and family and we need to make sure they are happily settled in their new environment. To make sure this happens, we have a team of experts on hand who look after them from the moment they arrive in NZ, when we collect students from the airport, until they return to their home country. This team includes:

- the boarding house directors and matrons
- homestay co-ordinator
- the international student manager
- school counsellors
- school nurse
- academic deans

We have an orientation programme for new international students. They also attend a transition programme with a counsellor which helps with the adjustment to St Peter's and any issues that can arise when living away from home.

We encourage parents to stay in touch both with the school and their children. Parents are always welcome to email or phone any members of your child's support team.

Students do not need a guardian but there must be a parent, agent or family friend who speaks English and can act as a contact for St Peter's.



Academic Results

ST PETER'S STUDENTS are high academic achievers. Students consistently obtain 90-99% pass rates in national and international exams.

STUDENTS IN YEARS 7-10 study the core subjects of English, social studies, mathematics, science, physical education, health and religious studies. They also select one or two optional subjects from a wide range of choices, including art, commerce, dance, drama, equine, fabric, French, food, graphics, Japanese, music and sports studies.

SENIOR SCHOOL (YEARS 11-13) students choose five or six subjects from a list of 40 different options. These include accounting, biology, calculus, chemistry, computers, dance, design, drama, economics, English, fashion design, French, geography, graphics, history, hospitality, graphics, Japanese, mathematics, media, music, outdoor education, painting, photography, physics and sports science.

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Curriculum

ST PETER'S is accredited by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) to deliver the national curriculum to students in Years 7-13 (ages 11-18).

Students study the National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) level one in Year 11. In years 12-13 students can choose between NCEA and the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme.

English language support

A SPECIALIST ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROGRAMME is offered to all international students, including one-on-one assistance and New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) registered courses which lead to national qualifications.

The ESOL programmes aim to develop each student's English proficiency to a level which ensures successful study can be undertaken in English at undergraduate university level. Private tuition is available on a user pays basis in ESOL and other subjects. Preparation for international English language testing system (IELTS) is also available.

A strong sporting culture

FROM BEGINNER TO ELITE, students have access to world class facilities and a choice of over 30 sport options, assisted by specialist coaches, qualified teachers and managers. Sport is an important part of school life and all St Peter's students are expected to take part in at least one chosen sport.

Performing arts

The lively creative scene at St Peter's gives students plenty of opportunity to express themselves, share their passion and showcase their talent. A huge number of choices and talented staff ensure that there is something exciting for every level of skill.

Students can chose to pursue music, dance and drama to senior level as an academic subject. Or they can take advantage of the long list of extra-curricular activities such as music groups, dance troupes, and drama clubs as individual instrumental tuition and singing lessons.

School events include: stage challenge, the annual musical theatre production, the Stars concert, the International Assembly and the Performing Arts Festival.





The sound of a 21 piece live orchestra reverberating through the auditorium, tapping of 44 pairs of dance shoes on stage, over 100 stage lights setting the scene, a dazzling array of props and costumes, months of rehearsals building up to this moment in front of a packed audience... this is the St Peter's annual production and you won't want to miss it. St Peter's productions are legendary.



Boarding and homestays

Most of our international students will live in age-related boarding houses on the school campus. There are eight separate boarding houses, four for girls, and four for boys. The boarding houses are comfortable and modern, and most students have their own room or cubicle. They also include common rooms which have computers and televisions. Supervision and support is provided by house directors, house assistants and house matrons. Boarders have access to the school library and computer labs after school hours. Homework is supervised in the boarding houses.

Boarders have their meals in the dining hall, and they are joined by the day students for a cooked lunch each day.

A small number of international students live with New Zealand families in homestays which are selected by the school. These students travel to school on the school buses with all the other day students. Homestays are also used by international students during school holidays between terms and on the eight leave weekends a year.

Homestays are carefully chosen and vetted by the school and they need to meet a strict criteria. They are selected and monitored according to the rules in the Code of Practice.

A typical day

Monday - Friday

| 6.30am | Wake up, shower and dress |

| 3.20pm after school | Extracurricular activities |
| 5.00pm | Dinner and return to boarding house |
| 6.30pm - 9pm | Supervised prep (homework). The time varies according to the year group |
| 9.15pm onwards | Bedtime and lights out. |

SATURDAY

Students follow a similar routine to the rest of the week, but without classes. Most students are involved with sport or extracurricular activities. Leave is available following extracurricular activities.

SUNDAY

Students can sleep in until 10am. The day is free, with time for optional activities such as house outings, and movies and shopping trips.



How to Apply

STUDENTS ARE SELECTED ON THE BASIS OF THEIR ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT, CHARACTER AND THEIR INVOLVEMENT IN EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES.

- 1. Return completed application forms and attach a copy of the passport and latest school report
- 2. St Peter's will send you an Offer of Place which will include a fees invoice.
- 3. You pay the school fees
- 4. St Peter's will send a receipt
- 5. You apply to the NZ Embassy for student visas
- 6. When the visa is granted you advise St Peter's of travel plans.

St Peter's has authorised agents in countries around the world. Contact us for an agent in your country.

FEES

Tuition and Boarding fees are set by the St Peter's Trust Board in September each year. The fees vary according to the age of the student. In 2016 the fees are:
